To be submitted to the people of the State at the next General Election, to be held on the seventh day of November, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and seventy.

JOINT RESOLUTION Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of the State of Louisiana, to be submitted to the people of the State at the next general election for representatives to the General Assembly.

Section 1. Be it resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Louisiana in General Assembly convened, two-thirds of the members elected to each House agreeing thereto, That at the general election for members of the General Assembly, to be held on the seventh day of November, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and seventy, which will take place in November, eighteen hundred and seventy, an amendment to the constitution of the State shall be submitted to the people of the State, and if a majority of the voters at said election approve and ratify such amendment, the same shall become a part of the constitution, to wit:

Article — No person who, at any time, may have been a collector of profit or trust, or who may have been otherwise intrusted with public money, shall be eligible to the General Assembly, or to any office of profit or trust, until he shall have obtained a discharge for the amount of such collections and for all public moneys with which he may have been intrusted.
