CITY COUNCIL—OFFICIAL

SPECIAL MEETING.

A special meeting of the Council was held at 7 P. M. Mayor Flanders presided, and there were present Administrators West (Improvements), Shaw (Accounts), Delassie (Public Buildings), Enley (Commerce), Pierce (Police), and Walton (Finance).

The Mayor said this meeting had been called at the request of several members of the board, for a purpose which would be explained.

Mr. Walton said it was understood that the two parties in the field for the election to be held on the seventh of November next, both contemplated holding torchlight processions on Saturday evening, and that there was some risk of collision and bloodshed if this programme should be carried out.

An ordinance prohibiting certain processions in the streets of the city of New Orleans, was read and adopted.

Whereas a number of persons attached to the several political parties organized or existing in the city of New Orleans contemplate having processions in this city prior to the election to be held on the seventh of November, 1870;

And whereas a large number of good citizens attached to all political parties are apprehensive that public processions of this kind, or of persons connected therewith, or acting in the interest thereof, will be the cause of disorder, tumult and bloodshed, thereby subjecting the property and lives of the people to great risk of damage and loss;

Be it therefore ordained by the Council of the city of New Orleans, that after the passage of this ordinance any and all clubs, organizations, or bodies of men of a political character, are forbidden and prohibited from marching in procession through the public streets of the city.

Sec. 2. Be it further ordained, etc. That the Department of Police be and is hereby authorized to take proper measures for the enforcement of this ordinance; and all good citizens are earnestly requested to lend their countenance and assistance for the preservation of the public peace.

Sec. 3. Be it further ordained, etc. That this ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, and continue to have full force and effect until the eighth day of November, 1870.

Mr. West seconded the adoption of the ordinance. The roll was called, and the ordinance was unanimously adopted.

On motion of Mr. Pierce, it was resolved that a copy of the ordinance be furnished to each of the daily papers of the city.

The Council then adjourned.
