WASHINGTON, November 1.—From official returns made during the same period, it appears that the total number of immigrants arriving at the port of New York during the quarter ending September 30, 1870, was 51,197, of which 24,175 were males, and 27,022 females.

Wreck of the Cambria Found. LONDON, November 3.—The wreck of the steamship Cambria has been found, and the mystery attending the calamity which befell her has been solved.

Naval Court Martial. The findings of the naval court martial in session at the navy yard in Washington in the case of Paymaster Richard Washington, who was tried for a deficiency of his accounts of \$20,000, are in favor of the Secretary of the Navy awaiting revision.

The Norfolk Riot. A Washington special to the Chicago Tribune says: The riot in Norfolk was a prearranged. It began by members of the police force, who were ex-Confederates and citizens, firing into the crowd without provocation.

WASHINGTON, November 4.—In the distribution of the national bank currency the applications for the notes have as yet amounted to only one-third of the amount which it is entitled to.

As yet, only one gold bank in Boston is in actual operation. The New York bank after an organization had been effected, and authority given to begin, withdrew from the field to-day, and a new application for permission to start a gold bank was received from that city.

LAW OF THE UNITED STATES

Passed at the Second Session of the Forty-first Congress.

[Public—No. 164.]

AN ACT TO REPEAL INTERNAL TAXES, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That after and after the first day of May, eighteen hundred and seventy-one, the special taxes imposed by the several sections of the act entitled "An act to provide internal revenue to support the government, to pay interest on the public debt, and for other purposes," approved June thirty, eighteen hundred and sixty-six, as amended by section nine of the internal revenue act approved July thirteen, eighteen hundred and sixty-six, and as amended by section five of the internal revenue act approved March twenty-eight hundred and sixty-seven, be and the same are hereby repealed; but this act shall not be held to repeal or annul any act, or any provision thereof, imposed by said sections of the special taxes imposed by the act approved July twenty, eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, entitled "An act to amend the act approved June thirty, eighteen hundred and sixty-six, and for other purposes," or the act approved October, eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, and for other purposes, or the act approved October, eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, and for other purposes.

Sec. 2. And be it further enacted, That after and after the first day of October, eighteen hundred and seventy, the several taxes imposed by the internal revenue laws now in force, saving and excepting such taxes on sales as are imposed by law by stamp, and the taxes on sales of leaf tobacco, manufactured tobacco, snuff, cigars, foreign and domestic distilled spirits, and wines, imposed by said act, approved July thirteen, eighteen hundred and sixty-six, and acts amendatory thereof, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. And be it further enacted, That after and after the first day of October, eighteen hundred and seventy, the taxes imposed by the internal revenue laws, now in force, herein specified, be and the same are hereby repealed: To-wit: On the sale of stamps, and the taxes on sales of leaf tobacco, manufactured tobacco, snuff, cigars, foreign and domestic distilled spirits, and wines, imposed by said act, approved July thirteen, eighteen hundred and sixty-six, and acts amendatory thereof, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Sec. 4. And be it further enacted, That after and after the first day of October, eighteen hundred and seventy, the stamp tax imposed in schedule B, on promissory notes for a less sum than one hundred dollars, and on any other instrument, and on any money, or for the payment of any debt, and the stamp tax imposed in schedule C, on any instrument, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Sec. 5. And be it further enacted, That after and after the first day of October, eighteen hundred and seventy, the stamp tax imposed in schedule B, on promissory notes for a less sum than one hundred dollars, and on any other instrument, and on any money, or for the payment of any debt, and the stamp tax imposed in schedule C, on any instrument, be and the same are hereby repealed.
