

The report of the Commissioner of Education is a voluminous document, seventy pages in length, and with accompanying documents, will make a volume of five or six hundred pages.

The condition of the educational work in the South is treated at length, and the progress in each State noted. The upshot is that many of the States have good systems, but the apathy or open opposition to large classes make them inefficient.

The provision by the government of a system of free schools in the Territory is urged, and it is hoped that Congressional action is submitted.

A large space is given to the consideration of the education of the Indians. Some general legislation in the Indian school system is asked, which system ought to be in a great part industrial.

The constant calls for information received from various sources tend to show the interest of other countries in our experiment.

Professor Day, of New Haven, furnishes an interesting paper on the necessary changes in the educational system of Chinese emigrants.

There is much about the relations of education and labor, and a report on technical schools by Robert J. Heron, the statistics of which are very interesting.

Through the education of women, the progress of the general intelligence, and the topics treated are of a proposed national university at the Capital; teachers' associations; college statistics; agricultural schools; and the education of blind, deaf, idiotic and insane, and prison schools wherever possible.

The statistics here are as complete as possible.

Indian Affairs. The report of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, which has been printed, is no less lengthy as previous reports from that office, but gives in thorough detail interesting facts concerning the Indian policy of the government.

The mission exercises which have been carried into practical effect by the Quaker agents are highly eulogized, and it is hoped to render the tribes more amenable to the requirements of the government and the dictates of civilization than formerly.
