INQUEST.—Coroner Craigh yesterday held an inquest in the Charity Hospital on the body of Theodore Basini, thirteen years old, a native of Italy, who came to his death from injuries received by being run over by the truck of Peliccia Hook and Ladder Company No. 4.

Also, on the body of Robert Condon, three years old, at No. 60 Delord street, who came to his death from the effects of burns received by his clothing taking fire by accident.

CLAYTON, WILLIAMS & CO.—Rumor, to a limited extent, obtained credence that this sharp firm, which found a sudden but lamentable oblivion, recently made overtures or proposals to Superintendent Badger to compromise with their victims by returning a large portion of the ill-gotten gains. This rumor is so manifestly absurd that a denial is unnecessary.
