ON CARONDELET STREET. The relief in the money market which has so long been hoped for, has come even sooner than was anticipated. There are not only no complaints of stringency, but the general remark is that money is easy. At the same time the New York papers report a growing scarcity in that market, caused by an excessive drain of currency to the West and South. Of course this process is natural enough, and it was inevitable unless contracted by some more powerful opposing influence. The tendency of currency is to equalize itself in reference to the necessities of the different parts of the country; that is to say its distribution depends upon the general law of supply and demand. The high rate of interest prevailing here during some weeks, must have resulted in attracting money from other parts of the country, and thus the market would be relieved independently of the accumulation arising from the sale of agricultural products. This consumption has, moreover, been aided by the absence of a speculative feeling in New York, operations in stocks having, for some time, been confined to the few wealthy operators who are interested in and control the great railway companies. Indeed, outside operators have learned to avoid Wall street, as they have no chance for anything but a loss of money in face of the organized cliques who control and manipulate the stock market.

As we have already said, our money market is now easy, and it seems strange in view of this fact, that business on the street is so dull. The general opinion of the brokers is that so barren a season has rarely been known. As money became abundant stocks ought to have advanced; there should have been some renewal of animation; we should have observed that buoyancy which usually accompanies an early market, and which is the concomitant of more or less energetic speculative movements. But, instead of this, every thing has subsided to a dead level of dullness and stagnation. Easy stocks are scarcely mentioned in the street. Nobody wants them; everybody seems to avoid them as if by common consent. Even the standard stocks are slow of sale, and scarcely show the influence of the approaching dividends.

Slughterhouse stock weakened again yesterday. In the morning it seemed to rally a little and six hundred shares were sold at 23. But, toward afternoon, it fell off again and was even offered as low as 22. Many persons attributed this decline to a "bear" movement, which is said to originate in quarters which would seem to be interested in supporting the stock. The general absence of outside speculation would seem, however, to be a sufficient explanation. Whatever the cause may be, it is sufficiently disgusting to the sanguine holders who have been waiting long and patiently for forty dollars a share, but who have thus far been cruelly disappointed.
