SEVENTH DAY'S PROCEEDINGS. Monday, January 10, 1871.

The Senate met pursuant to adjournment. Present: Hon. O. J. Dunn, Lieutenant Governor and President of the Senate; Messrs. Anderson, Antoine, Barber, Blackburn, Bowman, Butler, Campbell, Compadre, Daigle, Fish, Fulton, Gallip, Harris, Hevzig, Hunsaker, Ingraham, Kelso, Lewis, Lynch, McMillen, Nolan, Pierce, Ragan, Swoyer, Spher, Thompson, Todd, Twitchell, Whitney, Wilcox—33.

The minutes were partially read, when the further reading was dispensed with.

By Mr. Twichell: Of a bill to be entitled an act to form a new parish, to be called the parish of Warmouth.

By Mr. Campbell: Of a bill to be entitled an act relative to the New Orleans and Northeastern Railroad Company, to provide for the extension of the main line of their railroad to the city of New Orleans for the building of one or more branches to the main line of said railroad; to regulate judicial proceedings in certain cases, and to facilitate and aid the construction and secure the maintenance of said railroad within the State of Louisiana.

By Mr. Anderson: Of a bill to be entitled an act for the relief of R. Richard, Sr., of St. Landry.

Also, a bill to be entitled an act to purchase five hundred copies each of the Revised Civil Code and the Revised Code of Practice of the State of Louisiana, edited by Albert Voorhies.

By Mr. Ragan: A bill to be entitled an act granting corporate privilege to the inhabitants of Baton Rouge, in the parish of East Baton Rouge, and to provide for the government of the affairs thereof, and to repeal an act entitled "An act to amend the several acts relative to the police and government of the city of Baton Rouge," approved April 2, 1850; and to repeal all acts amendatory thereto; and to repeal "An act to provide for the government of the city of Baton Rouge," approved March 8, 1850; and to repeal all acts amendatory thereto.

Passed its first reading. The constitutional rule was suspended by a four-fifths affirmative vote, and the bill put on its second reading for the purpose of reference.

By Mr. Thomas: Of a bill to be entitled an act for the relief of Robert F. Scoppin and Francois Lacroix, and to pay the damages due and assessed on the tenth day of May, 1870, under the provisions of an act of the Legislature, entitled "An act to provide for the making of a cut-off at Scoppin's Point on Red River," approved on the fifteenth day of March, 1850.

Passed its first reading. The constitutional rule was suspended by a four-fifths affirmative vote, and the bill put on its second reading for the purpose of reference.

By Mr. Wilson: Of a bill to be entitled an act to regulate the practice and dispositive business in the district courts of the parish of Orleans.

The constitutional rule was suspended by a four-fifths affirmative vote, and the bill put on its second reading for the purpose of reference.

By Mr. O'Hara: By unanimous consent, introduced an act entitled "An act providing for the appointment of a District Attorney in each parish, and defining his duties and powers, and the mode of proceeding in criminal cases in the district and parish courts; and providing for the salary and fees of the Parish and District Attorneys pro tempore," approved September 29, 1868.

Which passed its first reading. The constitutional rule was suspended by a four-fifths affirmative vote, and the bill put on its second reading for the purpose of reference.
