THE COURTS.

United States Circuit Court—Hon. W. B. Wood.

Holzman vs. Measell White et al.—In this case the jury rendered the following verdict:

We, the jury, accord to the plaintiff a verdict for the sum of two thousand dollars.

Right hundred already paid against Measell White, Jr., and in favor of the other heirs of Measell White, Sr.

In accordance with which it was ordered that George Holzman, executor of the estate of Measell White, Jr., the sum of \$2,000, with five per cent interest thereon from this day till paid, and costs of suit; and that a writ of injunction be granted against Measell White, Jr., and against Mrs. Eliza Bollitt, there be judgment in their favor and against the plaintiff, with costs.

In the case of the steamboat Saratoga vs. 438 bales of cotton; Robert Maxwell vs. the steamboat Thomas Powell, and Wingard vs. the Laton, motions have been submitted for new trials.

Case of Lasse vs. Mrs. Marth et al.—This is a suit on a verbal contract made in 1850, which the plaintiff alleges was entered into by defendants, for the erection of a monument over the remains of their ancestors in the Catholic cemetery in Pattersonville, parish of St. Mary. The model presented of the work is really fine. The plaintiff is a native of Switzerland, and had just arrived in this country when he undertook the work.

The defense put in a general denial, and say that they are not responsible, either individually or in solidum, that the work was done in accordance with the contract, and that any obligation is due to the defendant, it is due by her sister, made party to this suit.
