MEETING OF THE BOARD OF SCHOOL DIRECTORS.

The recently elected members of the Board of School Directors met last night, at No. 38 Burgundy street, for the purpose of organizing.

As soon as a sufficient number of the members arrived, Judge H. C. Dibble mounted the platform and stated that he would, in compliance with the request of several members, call the board to order.

Mr. Lyne requested the Chair to appoint a temporary secretary. Mr. Toy moved that Mr. Kendall, the secretary of the old board of directors, be appointed to the temporary position.

Mr. Pinchback seconded the "request" of Mr. Lyne, that the Chair should appoint Mr. Boothby (member from the seventh district) to the position.

Mr. Boothby took his place at the secretary's desk, and the temporary organization was declared by the Chair to be perfected.

On motion of Mr. Dibble, a committee of two was appointed to examine the credentials and qualifications of members, and instructed to report immediately.

Mr. Hahn called the attention of the board to the necessity of making an estimate of the probable amount that will be required to support the schools for the ensuing year.

On motion a committee of three, to draft rules, was appointed, consisting of Messrs. Hahn, Boothby and Pinchback.
