MURDER WILL OUT. Mystery of the Nathan Assassination—Full Description of the Murderer.

New York, March 8.—The Tribune tomorrow will publish the following: "The mystery that has so long attended the Nathan murder seems at length cleared up. Superintendent Kelo has no doubt that the murderer is a well-known thief and desperado, named William Forrester, with half a dozen aliases."

James J. Kelo, Superintendent of Police of the City of New York, has a photograph of Forrester accompanies the circular. Although Superintendent Kelo is so positive that Forrester is the murderer, he declines to give the name on which he bases his belief, on the ground that it would injure the proper working of the case.

Although the superintendent declines to give the source from which the information is derived that fastens suspicion on Forrester, it is certain that the name was obtained from George Ellis, now serving out a term in Sing Sing for burglary on the night of January 27, 1870, when the office of L. & M. Migel, at No. 23 East Twenty-fifth street, was robbed of certain articles worth several thousand dollars.

They did not suppose that Nathan or his agents were in the house, as it was known that the Nathans were passing the summer at a country residence at Morristown, New Jersey. The thief was discovered by Nathan while operating on a safe in a room adjoining the one in which he was known to be killed by Forrester with the iron "dog."

These are believed to be the principal facts on which Superintendent Kelo, Justice Bayling and the police are based in their belief that Forrester is the assassin. In addition, ever since the murder he has avoided all his old companions, and has been seen in the company of persons known to him in this and other cities. It is more than probable that he is in some out-of-the-way place in the far West, or in some small country town, working as a laborer at a trade, endeavoring by his means to elude suspicion. Certain it is that he has not been seen by the police of any of our large cities since the murder. He is too well known to the heads of police in various cities to have escaped their search had he made his appearance in any large town.

Forrester has been a thief from his youth, and has served several terms in State prisons. He is a native of Illinois, having escaped from jail there, after serving a small part of a term of thirteen years, for burglary committed in Illinois. There is no question but that Superintendent Kelo and those who connect him with the murder are on the track of the real murderer. This is shown by the fact that there are no conditions attached to the reward offered for the arrest of Forrester. Whether the alleged murderer is convicted or not the reward will be paid to whoever may deliver him into the hands of Superintendent Kelo.

Ka-Klux Terrors. The condition of affairs in South Carolina, according to the following dispatch, is not very cheerful: WASHINGTON, March 7.—Governor Scott has called upon the President for United States troops to suppress outrages in the counties of Union and South Carolina, where he reports that men are murdered or driven from their homes nightly because of their political opinions.
