AMENDMENT TO CHARTER. At two consecutive meetings of the Board of Directors of the New Orleans Hydrocarbon Gaslight Company, it was resolved that the stock certificates of incorporation be amended by substituting the following article in lieu and stead thereof:

ARTICLE III. The capital stock of this corporation shall be fixed at the sum of three hundred thousand dollars, divided into three thousand shares of one hundred dollars each, of which capital two hundred thousand dollars shall be paid up.
