Total Loss of Cargo—Entire Loss \$125,000.

The St. Louis Republic, of Sunday, gives us some details of the loss of the steamer Olive Branch, already reported by telegraph.

A dispatch was received yesterday morning by Messrs. Stillwell, Powell & Co., from Captain John T. McCord, of the Olive Branch, which contained the following information:
