A PROCLAMATION by the President of the United States of America. WHEREAS, Divers evil-disposed persons have, at sundry times, within the territory or jurisdiction of the United States, begun, or set on foot, or prepared the means for military or other enterprises to be carried on there against the territories or dominions of powers with whom the United States are at peace...

WHEREAS, It is provided in the Constitution of the United States that the United States shall protect every State in this Union, on application of the Legislature, or the executive (when the Legislature cannot be convened), against domestic violence.

ARTICLE I. His Majesty the Emperor of China, being of the opinion that in making concessions to the citizens of the United States, the cent of the privilege of residing on certain tracts of land, or resorting to certain waters of that empire for purposes of trade or commerce, he has relinquished his right of eminent domain or dominion over the said land and waters...

ARTICLE II. There shall be an exchange of consular offices between the United States of America and New Zealand, by means of the direct line of colonial mail packets plying between San Francisco and said colony...

ARTICLE III. The Emperor of China shall have the right to appoint consuls at ports of the United States, and to exercise the same privileges and immunities as those which are enjoyed by public law and treaty abroad...

ARTICLE IV. The twenty-ninth article of the treaty of the eighteenth of June, eighteen hundred and fifty-eight, having stipulated for the exemption of Christian citizens of the United States from all levies or contributions of their faith, it is further agreed that citizens of the United States in China, of every religious persuasion, and Chinese subjects in the United States, shall be exempt from all disability or persecution on account of their religious faith or worship in either country...

ARTICLE V. The United States of America and the Emperor of China cordially recognize the inherent and inalienable right of man to change his home and allegiance, and also the mutual advantage of the free migration of their people...

ARTICLE VI. Citizens of the United States, visiting or residing in China, shall enjoy the same rights and privileges as are accorded to the most favored nation, and, reciprocally, Chinese subjects may enjoy the same privileges and immunities in the United States...

The Emperor of China reserves to himself the right to decide the time and manner and circumstances of any improvements in telegraphs, as within his dominions, such improvements, understanding it is agreed by the contracting parties that if at any time hereafter his Imperial Majesty shall determine to construct or cause to be constructed works of the character mentioned within the empire, and shall make application to the United States or any other western power for facilities to carry out his policy, the United States will, in that case, consent to authorize suitable engineers to be employed by the Chinese government, and will recommend to other nations an equal compliance with such application...
