ICE IN THE POTOMAC. The steamer 'Anglia' was quarantined to-day with small-pox. Arrived out of City of Brussels, City of Baltimore, Erin and Lissa Webb. Arrived: South Carolina. Evening—Money closed active at 7 per cent currency to gold. Sterling 9. Gold 110—sold at 110 during the day. Government bonds steady; new South Carolina very active; balance dull and unchanged; Tennessee old and new, 65.

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BILL TO ESTABLISH MAIL LINES. The bill to establish mail lines between New Orleans and Mexico, introduced by Mr. Kellogg, of Louisiana, and passed by the House of Representatives, is now in the hands of the Senate. The bill provides for the establishment of a mail service between New Orleans and Mexico, and also for the reorganization of district courts in Louisiana.

SNOW AT VARIOUS POINTS. A sharp discussion occurred between Messrs. Wood and Dawes, regarding the continuance of the committee on insurrectionary States, which Mr. Wood maintained was a trick to continue the reconstruction committee in the hands of the President. The administration sustained its first defeat of the session on the subject of the postal telegraph. Mr. Dawes moved to refer to a select committee so much of the President's message as recommended the adoption of the telegraph system in the postal service of the country. This was opposed by Messrs. Randall, Farnsworth, Kellogg and several other members of the House. The subject should not be taken from the standing committee and referred to a select one, which would necessarily, under the parliamentary rule, have a majority in favor of the telegraph.

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FOREIGN.

Acquisition of Africa Diamond Fields. The acquisition of the Africa diamond fields by England has been completed by contract. Recent findings were made by violent storms recently destroyed much property and some lives. The Prince of Wales is recovering slowly, but steadily, and public apprehensions are measurably subsided.

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THE NEW GOVERNOR OF OUBA. The new Governor of Ouba is Mr. Wood. He is a member of the House of Representatives and has been appointed to the position.

DECLINE OF CUBAN REBELLION. The Cuban rebellion is declining. The Spanish government has been successful in its operations against the rebels.

GREAT FIRE IN PARIS. A great fire broke out in Paris on the night of the 5th inst. The fire was caused by a gas lamp and destroyed a large amount of property.

NATIONAL ASSEMBLY ORGANIZED. The National Assembly has been organized. It will meet in Paris on the 15th inst.

WAR STEAMERS AT HAVANA. Several war steamers are at Havana. They are being used for the purpose of protecting the Spanish coast.

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
