Charge of the Russian Legation—Long Cabinet Meeting—Decrease of Public Debt—Grand Duke Invited to Revisit Washington.

Washington, January 2.—Valerian Sokoloff assumed charge of the Russian Legation.

There was a long Cabinet meeting to-day, after which the President and Akerman had a conversation, supposed over the R. R.

The debt statement shows a decrease of nearly \$4,500,000; on interest \$111,000,000; currency \$15,750,000.

It is understood that as soon as it was ascertained Mr. Catecazy had been definitely recalled, the President directed that the Grand Duke be invited to revisit Washington.

The invitation was declined from the excuses connected with the service of the Russian squadron, in which he is lieutenant.
