Your committee deems that this act is a measure of great interest to the cotton factors of this port, and will prove beneficial to purchasers of the staple article, as this bill provides for an insurance of the cotton against the risk of the cotton purchased on the certificate of the corporation.

It is to cotton what the grain elevator is to cereals and the oil mill to oil. For on the certificate of this corporation, large business transactions can be had without moving the bulk of the cotton from the place of storage.
