THE CITY HALL.

The persistent neglect with which the interests of the insane are treated, has forced itself upon the attention of the public, and through it has given rise to much discussion. The difficulty in the way is the inability of those charged with the duty of selecting a suitable place for the erection of an insane asylum, and which will allow suitable grounds for exercise. The State asylum at Jackson is full to overflowing, and the necessity of making some sort of provision for those afflicted with this infirmity in the city grows every day more pressing.

In the hope of having a few of the inmates of the city insane asylum transferred to the State asylum, and alleviate the condition of those remaining, I confided during the past month with the secretary and treasurer of the State asylum to the practicality of such transfer. To my sorrow, the answer returned was that there were more patients in the State asylum than could properly be cared for.

The number of patients in the city asylum at the close of the past month (1872) was smaller than at any period during my administration, owing to the preponderance of withdrawals and deaths over admissions. The deaths (six) were chiefly caused by the impossibility of making the asylum building even adequate to the weakly constituted among its inmates during such intense cold weather as we have recently experienced.

In the month of January 28,830 cubic yards of earth were excavated on Orleans canal, between Bayou St. John and the lake, and Taylor avenue, in the rear of the City Park; 13,984 cubic yards were excavated in the upper drainage canal at Metairie road and near the lake; 16,544 cubic yards were excavated on Marguerite canal; 2,836 cubic yards were excavated on Metairie road levee, and 7,652 cubic yards of protection levee constructed near the lake shore.

The total expenditures of the Department of Police for the month of January amounted to \$29,836 10, of this \$29,737 55 was for lighting the city.

THE COURTS.

A piano is to be returned to the Sheriff for sale in the bankruptcy case of Ben. Bloomfield, on move to be shown on Saturday, the second of March.

The order in the bankruptcy case of J. G. Ellis, directing the Sheriff to deliver property to the assignee, was set aside. Funds in the case of J. D. Cox against the Lotawanna are ordered to be paid over in accordance with the decree of February 6, 1872.

In the case of William Doyle against the steamer it was decreed that, on deducting the claimant's claims, the balance to be paid to the satisfaction of the mortgage, held by several parties, in New Orleans, was \$14,124. The jury was discharged in the district court until to-day, and the absent ones ordered to be attached.

In the case of J. & Taylor against A. Levi, in the United States Circuit Court, the plaintiffs declining to go into trial, judgment was rendered in case of non-suit.

The case of King vs. King, in the district court, was decided by a jury in favor of plaintiff.

The case of Field & Kings vs. E. M. Ivens & Co. was likewise decided in favor of plaintiffs.

The injunction cases in the suits of Myra Clark Gaines against Messrs. De Lizardi, Monseigneur, Agly, Cronan, Lesseps, and Long are still pending in the district court.

In the Eighth District Court appeals have been taken in the various suits of the Slaughter-house Company against the butchers and the butchers against the Slaughter-house Company, returnable on the third Monday in March.

Senator Trumbull on Reform.

In the United States Senate, on the twenty-third instant, the resolution to investigate the alleged sales of arms to the French being up, Mr. Trumbull, of Ohio, took the floor.

He said that every effort at reform in this body was met by assaults upon those who earnestly aspired to their duty, and their motives being charged with bad party faith. Questions affecting the purity of the government and the welfare of the public are, in the opinion of some of the members of this body, not to be discussed in the halls of the Republican party, no longer to be decided on their merits, but only with the view to their bearing upon the party.
