UNITARIANISM. Sermon by Dr. Freeman Clarke at the Church of the Messiah - A Definition of Unitarianism - His Sermon by Keeping a Consistent View of the Bible.

At the Church of the Messiah yesterday morning, Dr. Freeman Clarke, the prominent divine of the Unitarian sect, preached a sermon that may be designated with great truthfulness as the Unitarian platform.

Dr. Clarke selected his text from the fifth chapter of the tenth verse - "I am not come to destroy the law, but to fulfill it."

It is often asked "What do Unitarians believe?" and in response to answer the question this morning, I shall dwell on the positive side of their belief, not the negative. People sometimes say, "you tell us what you do not believe, but we wish to know what you do believe in."

Let us remember, however, that a system is not necessarily negative because it looks so and is called so. Christianity at first looked very negative to the Jews.

Unitarianism is not come to destroy the law, but to fulfill it - not to make us less God, but more; not to give us less faith in Christ, but more; not to take away from the Bible, but to add to it; not to make us believe less in prayer, but to believe in it more fully; not to make us less earnest, grand, hopeful and divine, but more so.

Unitarianism adds to that Christian culture, Orthodoxy calls on men to begin. Unitarianism tells them to go on. Orthodoxy teaches the simple unity of God, but Unitarianism adds to that Christian culture, Orthodoxy calls on men to begin.

Unitarianism adds the other half by saying, "Grow up in all things into purity, honesty, generosity, kindness, gentleness, freedom, brotherhood." Orthodoxy says, "We are forgiven for Christ's sake and saved by Him." Unitarianism adds, "But only as we are forgiven for our own sake and saved ourselves."
