THE VAN NORDEN CASE.

Released on Habeas Corpus.

Yesterday morning the Supreme Court room was thronged with an audience that embodied the principal lawyers of the city.

The interested parties in the Lewis and Van Norden contest and their friends, a fair sprinkling of politicians and lookers-on, and a few who could come under the head of "citizens generally."

At eleven o'clock Chief Justice Luleig and Associate Justices Howe and Taliaferro took their seats on the bench, and Mr. Justice Taliaferro immediately read the opinion in the case.
