Local Intelligence.

AN IMPORTANT FACT DEMONSTRATED.—That portion of our city which runs the Washington avenue shell road, up few years ago, was a complete swamp only eight or nine years ago, but to-day many neat dwelling houses, profuse gardens and improved fields beautify the locality. This extensive change, or reclamation, was caused by two draining canals, the principal one having been dug by order of General Butler when he commanded this department. When that canal was dug out, in 1863, the earth was used to build what is now a high dry shell road. All the land on the northern side is useful, having raised several inches since the canals were opened. This assertion about land "lifting" may not be well understood by some people; therefore we will give figures as furnished us by Mr. William Baker, who obtained them through practical experience. He took a cubic foot of earth from a low point in the rock of our city. Of course, it was well soaked with water. He ascertained that the soil used in the experiment contained ten pounds of water. He placed the earth in a box in order that it might dry gradually, the box at first exactly holding the quantity. When partly dried it was taken out and pulverized, allowing all the moisture to evaporate. An attempt to replace the earth in the box proved futile, as fully one-third could not be replaced. Allowing that the bulk was one-third greater than when dug, and supposing that the cubic foot was drained or dried in the spot where it was taken from, the extra size must find a place for itself. It could not push downward, nor toward the sides, therefore it necessarily must rise. The experiment is an interesting one, and can be tested with little trouble. Scientific persons are tolerably well acquainted with these things, but there are men who will deny them, although demonstrated before their eyes. It was the draining of the swamp land mentioned which caused the great and useful change, and doubtless City Surveyor Bell will bear us out in details.

A FORTIFIED SPADE.—During our peregrinations about the suburbs we repeatedly noticed gardeners using an instrument for spreading the ground which looked like an expanded pitchfork, but which was really a new-fangled spade. A gentleman informs us that in turning the ground in his garden this spring he used one of these implements, and found it far superior to an ordinary spade in two senses. First, it required much less labor to handle it, and second, that it pulverized the upturned ground ten fold better than does an ordinary spade—and he knows something about farming. He desires that we give our readers the benefit of his experience. It is proper to add that the spading fork is an old implement of gardening at the North.

THE SECOND WARD DEMOCRATS.—An enthusiastic meeting of the unaffiliated of the second ward was held last night at the Louisiana Hotel, opposite St. Mary Market. William J. Hammond presided, with that old-time Democrat, Archie Mitchell, as a vice and general supporter. THE NEW BERTHA SUPER-LOAD SAYS.—The New Bertha Super-Load says: We are glad to be able to announce that the work of extending the New Orleans, Mobile and Texas railroad to Houston, Texas, has begun in earnest. Several hundred Chinamen are at work repairing the old track near the city. From rails have already been laid there, crosses are being rapidly got out; the bridge contractor is on the spot, getting out timber for the bridge at Brashear City, which he expects to have complete during the summer. On Thursday night last the steamer Ida brought up about seven-fifty men to work on the section beyond Vermilionville. We may expect the road to be completed to this point in a few months.

THE COURTS.

United States District Court.—In Admiralty. Parties in interest are shown cause, on April 1, why the commission of the vessel not approved in the case against the Ida, and the proceeds distributed in accordance with law.

Time to receive was taken in the exception in the case of the United States against the steamers Indiana, Henry Ames, C. B. Church and Dexter, originally libeled for transportation of sepioline oil, "refuse of coal oil" and other inflammable and combustible liquid, without complying with the customary forms.

Rule in the case of Cunningham and others against steamer Santa Martha dismissed for want of due diligence.

The voluminous testimony in the case of the tug Teddum in collision with the London is ordered printed, the losing party paying for the same.

United States District Court.—In Bankruptcy. Rule for contempt against the Commercial Bulletin Printing Company dismissed on suggesting the compliance of the defendant with the order of the court.

The marshal is to deliver to E. E. Norton, assignee, the bankrupt's property in the case of Isaac Raas.

In the case of Phelps, McCullough & Co. against W. White, an injunction issued, restraining the Sheriff from selling the steamboat Katie or taking action under judgment of a State court "until further order of this court."

The rule, after suggesting the pending application against J. M. White, to declare him a bankrupt, goes on to say that White confessed judgment in the Fourth District Court for the parish of Orleans, that he might defeat the purpose of the bankruptcy act and D. C. McCann & Son, in whose favor judgment was confessed, were about to proceed, by writ of execution, to go for the Katie, when the injunction puts a stopper on it.

During the progress of a case in this court the counsel for the defendant declared that he had a mortgage on the land and art as to deny adequate description.
