MISCELLANEOUS Methodist Conference—Bishop Ames Presiding—Steamer returned at Richmond—Governor Reed's Impeachment Trial—Memphis Races—Killed by Lowry Oulton.

NEW YORK, May 3.—The American Society for Prevention of Cruelty to Animals held their annual meeting, and re-elected Henry Bergh president and Henry Chase treasurer.

The treasurer's report shows a balance in cash of \$22,000, together with \$100,000 loaned by the Frenchman Bond, and \$50,000 secured by mortgages.

The African Methodist general conference in session in this city today appointed a committee to wait on the general conference in Brooklyn and present the views of this body on the proposition for unification.
