When the storm arose she sought shelter under a tree, and had not been there half a minute when she met her fate. Her shoulder was much blackened, but otherwise the body was not noticeably injured. During thunder storms persons should avoid the neighborhood of trees or other prominent objects as much as possible.

The two counterfeiters of nickels yesterday sent before the United States Court by Commissioner Weller, bonds \$2000 each. Falling to furnish the bonds, they were remanded to prison.

LAD KILLED—Corner Creagh held an inquest on the body of A. J. Landgraf, eleven years old, and ascertained that death was caused by internal injuries. Deceased was recently watching a game of base ball, near Douglas square, and a ball sent from a bat struck him in his abdomen.

ARRESTED—Hogan, the man charged with embezzling money from Mr. D. C. Johnson, was arrested last evening. He had failed to appear before the Criminal Court for trial on the day fixed.

FIRE YESTERDAY MORNING—About nine o'clock yesterday morning an alarm of fire was given from box No. 15, caused by the appearance of fire in the kitchen of the one-story frame building No. 85 Bilvair street. The building, a double house, was occupied by Mr. William Sheridan, who occupied one portion of it, the other half being occupied by Mr. McGary. The flames extended to the rear portion of the premises No. 86 St. Jane street, the property of Mrs. Kelly, and occupied by Mr. White. The loss sustained by Mr. Sheridan, including furniture, is estimated at about \$1250. Mr. McGary puts his loss in damage to furniture at about \$300. Mr. White's loss is \$300, and Mrs. Kelly's \$200. The cause of the fire was accidental. No insurance on any of the property.

A hoghead of bacon left in front of the Delta warehouse Monday night, was lighted several pounds by the dexterity of Officer Lewis, who was captured by Officer Brown. Another bacon thief with Lewis escaped, after dropping a sack of meat.

The bids for constructing machinery and extending the Waterworks to enable them to furnish 30,000,000 of gallons of water per diem and raise the supply to the height of 100 feet in buildings, were opened Monday morning by the Mayor and Administrators of Finance and Waterworks. That of Mr. L. H. Pihé was \$230,000, and the bid of Mr. Sylvester Bennett \$73,510, \$76,715 the lowest. But two bids were presented.

LETTER FROM WASHINGTON.

Irregularity of the Mails—The Republican Parisian. WASHINGTON, LA., June 28, 1872. EDITOR REPUBLICAN: I do not write with the view of complaining of you, but to advise you as to what is best to be done. I have written you some weeks since concerning the loss of the REPUBLICAN. Since that time we have received only one or two packages a week of the REPUBLICAN. We also lose one and two packages of other papers weekly, but it seems the REPUBLICAN has the preference. Now, if the thief would read them there might be some hope that he would become converted, and through charity save give us a share of the good things he seems bent upon depriving us of. It is now two months since this wholesale depredation commenced. Previously, say since July, 1871, the REPUBLICAN was first taken from the mail, and once, sometimes three times a week lost. But now nothing less than the whole will satisfy the rapacious appetite of this newspaper gorgon.

I have reason to believe that as Darrall has removed every postmaster from Berwick Bay to Washington—old and established officers fully in the confidence of the people—and replaced them with incompetent men or strangers, that some of his pets are at the bottom of this. Many here do not doubt it. There is not one solitary Grant paper taken at this office—it is known at the Customhouse; while to Opelousas is sent a package from Peckard's concern for dead-heads, there being not a paying subscriber there. That package is never missed. It arrives as regularly as could be desired, even by the most exacting subscribers.

A gentleman from Opelousas tells me that many packages of papers addressed to Opelousas are lost in the same way and never turn up. The inference drawn is this: These lost packages are purposely kept back by some one in the interest of the Customhouse clerk.
