

REPUBLICAN CONFERENCE.

Third Day's Proceedings—A Stormy Session—Speeches of the Day—Disruption of the Convention—Greely Members Withdraw—Two Conventions in Session.

With Charles Jaeger's harmonious prelude the convention started upon a new day of its least successful history.

President Campbell in the chair, showed the various parties represented and fourteen wards of the parish of Orleans.

Prayer by Rev. Mr. Armistead, of Caddo. Mr. L. E. Bentley, of Assumption, stated that the committee on conference were now reducing their report to writing, and asked that the convention adjourn until one o'clock.

On motion to entertaining the motion to adjourn, the president presented the report of the special committee appointed by the Republican State Convention of Louisiana, assembled in Turner Hall, New Orleans, August 9, 1872, which the secretary proceeded to read.

Mr. Dibble rose to a point of order, interrupting the secretary and insisting that the convention had nothing to do with that of August 9, and that the reading of the report was consequently out of order.

The chair ruled the point not well taken, and ordered the secretary to proceed.

Mr. Dibble moved to suspend the reading of the report, and on this took the floor and attempted to make a speech. He was received with a hostile and unrelenting silence, remarking, as he did so, that the delegates present were unfit to represent a free people.

The motion upon suspending the further reading of the report was put, a division called for, pending which, during a great deal of noise, the calling of the roll by parties was ordered.

Upon this arose an uproar, which the clear head and strong right arm of the president, feeling the evil hour of the presence of the delegates, for some time maintained. Finally a lull was reached—evidently the result of sheer exhaustion on the part of the noisy delegates.

The result of the vote was announced as follows: Aye 133; and the further reading of the report was suspended.

It was then moved to adopt the report as printed.

Mr. Dibble here took the floor to speak on the report. An uproar followed, and the only portion of Mr. Dibble's speech we could hear was: "Damn you, fool, sit down." Quiet being finally restored, Mr. Dibble went on to say that the motion to divert the report was simply an attempt to divert the attention of the convention from the national Republican ticket.
