CONSERVATIVE CONVENTION.

The fourth day's session was held yester

day, commencing at ten o'clock, Mr. Arch

bald Mitchell in the chair.

Mr. Collins, from the committee of con

ference, made a verbal report, and said:

Mr. President and Gentlemen of the Con

vention.—As chairman of the conference

committee, I have to report: 1. A communi

cation has been received from the Inde

pendent Republican conference committee,
