THE STATE ELECTION.

Losses and Gains by Parishes.

The Republican majority in Louisiana in 1870, taking the vote for Auditor as the standard, was 1,122.

As far as we have information from official sources, the result is as follows in the several parishes heard from:

Ascheland Parish—Republican gain 1,000.

West Baton Rouge Parish—Republican gain 1,000.

West Feliciana Parish—Republican gain 1,000.

Washington Parish—Republican gain 1,000.

In these seven parishes the Republicans gain 7,000 votes, and the fusionists gain 1,000, leaving a net gain for the fusionists of 6,000 votes. This reduces the Republican majority of 1870 to 52,000 in the remaining parishes.

We give to the fusionists as a gain their entire majority this year in Richland parish, as in 1870 the votes of all the polls in Richland were thrown out for "irregularities."

Desiring to sustain the reputation of the Republicans for accuracy, we have not given, in tabular form or otherwise, the wild reports of the votes in various parishes, based on conjecture alone, before the votes were counted. The official count will tell the true story, except in such cases as corrupt officials have attempted to thwart the will of the people by stuffing the ballot boxes, or substituting by hundreds fusion for Republican ballots.

Thus far we have reports of the election of twenty-seven Republicans and five fusionists to the House of Representatives.

St. John the Baptist Parish.

A correspondent writes us, dating the seventh instant, that the election in St. John the Baptist parish passed off very orderly and quietly, not a single disturbance occurring at any poll. The regular Republican ticket swept everything in the Smith-Burrell ticket running far behind, with the exception of the candidate for recorder, Zenon Miller, a gentleman of high standing, who was placed on the ballots ticket to give it strength, and was elected over Tony Smith.

Bonnis is elected to the House of Representatives over Hurrell by a large majority. Stamps, for Senator, also polled a heavy majority of the votes. The judge, sheriff, clerk of the court, coroner and justices of the peace on the regular Republican ticket are all elected by heavy majorities. L. De Poester, for district attorney, ran far ahead of Marks, as did also Judge Beauvais ahead of Flagg, for judge.

The ballots are all counted and the registrar is making up the tally list.

A Successful Dodge.

It may be surprising, but we believe it a fact, that hundreds, if not thousands, of colored men have been precluded restriction by the following outrageous trick, which seems to have been practiced in the parishes generally.

Whenever an ignorant or stupid looking colored man applied for registration, no matter if his hair was gray, he was saluted by the registrar somewhat as follows:

Registrar—"Are you twenty-one?"

The harsh and peremptory manner of addressing usually prevented the applicant stammering out more than a simple—

"Yes, sir."

Registrar—"How do you know you are? What year were you born in?"

Colored applicant (worse confused)—"I don't know, sir. I forget, sir."

Registrar—"Then get out of here. If you can't tell when you were born, how can you swear you are twenty-one? Leave."

And from this decision there was no appeal until the enforcement act provided one, which is being largely brought into requisition, we understand.

The State Election.

A dispatch from Amite gives the following: The official count for Washington parish gives Greeley 271, Lawrence 255, J. M. Thompson, for Senator, 330. A. C. Hickman, for Legislature, 82. The total vote cast was 657.

A Baton Rouge dispatch says: The official count of West Baton Rouge gives McEnery and Penn 280 majority; Fugate, for district judge, 360; Lobdell, for Legislature, 281. The parish has gone for Grant and Wilson, but the majority is not yet known.

A Lake Charles dispatch says: Greeley and the fusion ticket have carried every precinct in Cameron parish. The vote stands: Greeley 175, Grant 109, official.

PARISH ELECTION RETURNS.

The official returns from poll one of all the fifteen wards was completed yesterday, and also the returns from poll two of the second, third, sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth, eleventh, thirteenth and fifteenth wards.

Ordering to some discrepancy, the polls of the sixth and ninth (poll two), as well as poll one of the tenth ward, did not receive the official stamp. The remainder of poll two will be completed, it is anticipated, to-day, and the count will begin on poll three of each ward.
