## THE STATE HOUSE.

A number of distinguished visitors were

at the State House yesterday, and occupied

seats upon the floor of the Senate and

House of Representatives. Among them

were the Rev. Bishop Haven, of Boston,

and the Rev. Bishop Wiley, of Cincinnati.

These gentlemen were accompanied by the

Rev. Mr. Harris, of Ames Church, of this

city.

The Senate was called to order at twelve

o'clock, and there being a quorum present,

Bishop Haven was requested to open his

proceedings with prayer. Senator Hun-

aker gave notice of a bill for the relief of

J. N. Shawhan. Senator Greene gave notice

of two bills—one to create a new parish,

composed of portions of the parishes of

Jackson, Union, Claiborne and Bienville;

the other to charter a railroad from Ver-

millionville, by way of Alexandria and

Vienna, to Arkadelphia, Arkansas. The

same gentleman gave notice of a resolution

asking for a committee to investigate frauds

on the State treasury.

Senator Twitchell called up his bill, enti-

led "An act requiring real estate sold for

taxes or for other purposes to be paid for

by purchasers thereof, and for other pur-

poses." It was read a second time and re-

ferred to the Finance Committee. Senator

Weber's bill for the relief of taxpayers was

read and referred to the same committee.

Senator Brewer asked a suspension of the

rules, which was granted, to enable him to

introduce the following resolution:

WHEREAS, The State Library, containing

about two thousand volumes, and valued

at upward of \$100,000, is in imminent danger

of being destroyed by reason of the imper-

fect condition of the building, and already it

is reported a sufficient amount of

money has been appropriated to repair and

build a new building, which is now in the

hands of parties who have delayed in ex-

pending it in the manner designed by the

General Assembly;

Resolved, That the Committee on Librar-

ies, and the Committee on Finance, be and

they are hereby instructed, to make a

thorough investigation of the above state-

ment, and report as soon as practicable;

and that the committee also report what

legislation is necessary, if any, to require

the State Librarian to open and close at

such hours and on such days as will enable

the working people to visit it.

It was read and adopted.
