CORPORATIONS.

PARISH OF ORLEANS, CITY OF NEW ORLEANS. CHARTER OF THE NEW ORLEANS MUTUAL INSURANCE COMPANY.

ARTICLE I. The name of the company shall be 'The New Orleans Mutual Insurance Company' and its domicile is hereby established in the city of New Orleans.

ARTICLE II. The capital stock of the company shall be the purchase of, or building, or chartering of one or more houses, or both, on both sides up and down the Mississippi river and Red river and tributaries.

ARTICLE III. The capital stock of the company is hereby fixed at the sum of one hundred thousand dollars, divided into shares of one hundred dollars each.

ARTICLE IV. The affairs of the said company shall be under the direction of a Board of Control, composed of five stockholders, possessing in their own names at least five shares of the stock of the company.

ARTICLE V. The regular meeting of the stockholders shall be held annually on the third day of October, at which meeting a majority in capital stock shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE VI. The Board of Control shall have power to appoint all officers and directors of the company, and to remove them at any time.

ARTICLE VII. The period of service of any officer or director shall be for one year, and shall terminate on the first day of January following.

ARTICLE VIII. The name and respective interest of the subscribers to the capital stock of the company, as shown by the books of the company, shall be as follows:
