Inauguration of Havana Physician.

The well informed New Orleans correspondent of the National Gazette writes that that journal as follows, under date of the fourteenth ultimo.

As the main object of your valuable paper is to advance the interest of those who "go down to the sea in ships," I will relate to you and your readers two of the saddest cases of the ignorant and uneducated coast of Havana, a physician that I have ever heard of, resulting in the death of two of his victims, and a third of a broken heart.

Should my story, which is as true as it is sad, have any great bearing with your nautical readers, it will at least make them a little cautious how they take medicines administered by strangers.

The Spanish Cuba, of the Baltimore, New Orleans and Havana line, arrived at this port in December last. Her commander, Captain John M. DeLahar, a noble specimen of man, as well as sailor, removed to the house of his stevedore, Mr. Manning, and there treated by two of the best physicians in Havana.

After it was found that he could not recover, a consultation was held, and the facts ascertained that the physician who had attended him in Havana, given him several pills, of which, to use his own expression, "would kill a horse." The result was, they had eaten his bowels out, and at last his bowels, brain, and death relieved him of his sufferings.

Mr. Manning proved his sincere friendship by remaining at the bedside of his friend until he died. He was conscious almost up to the hour of his death. His last words were those of affection for his absent wife and child, and being assured by Mr. Manning that his body would be sent to his home in Baltimore, "so passed the brave, heroic soul away."

The second, and still more sad story was related to me by Captain Smith of the Maggie McNeil, in his own cabin, and as the blunt old sailor related the cause of death to his dear friends, the tears coursed down his cheeks like rain.

Within two months the ship Maria C. Day arrived in Havana from Europe. Captain John Chase, her commander, was well known and beloved by every one on the ship that was in any way connected with shipping. Two years ago he had a son who I had him good bye as the ship left the wharf, and I think that I was the last one to see him, as he was in the cabin of the ship, little thinking that I should never see him again—although all seafaring men know how uncertain is their life, still they seldom weep of it, and think of it as little as possible.

But to return to my story. While lying at Havana Mrs. Chase was taken ill. A physician was called, and she died. Her husband was found to be gradually sinking, and he was taken to the hospital, where he died. The result was, the poor woman lingered a few days and died.

After performing the duties of a physician, and after a long and arduous life, Captain Chase took to his bed, and in two days this strong, healthy sailor, who had weathered the gale upon gales, died of a broken heart.

Could there be anything more sad than this true, unvarnished tale, where three lives were sacrificed by the use of medicines administered by improper persons, and I should surely give them for the benefit of those who might in future be ill in Havana.

The ship Maria C. Day now lies in our port, and to those who know the genial sailor and the true man, Captain John Chase, she looks like a "marine coffin."

The Free List Suspended on the Union

A Washington special to the New York Herald says:

Mr. Horace F. Clark, president of the Union Pacific Railroad, now here upon business of the company, says that over three thousand free passes have been applied for in this territory, many of them in the interest of Senators and members of Congress, as well as other officials; but last night the executive committee decided that henceforth no free passes over the road shall either be printed or issued. The pro rata fare to San Francisco and return is \$112.

The directors of the company are trustees of the entire interests. The executive committee have been compelled to look into the rights and privileges of the company to issue free passes, as well as to look every possible revenue to the company to pay its working expenses and liabilities, and, if possible, dividends to stockholders. Now that the government withdraws the pay for freight, the necessity of cutting the free list is imperative. On a recent through train on the Pacific railroad there were eighty one free passes.

A New Line for Shipping Coal.

Philadelphia and Reading Coal and Iron Company will be ready to ship coal from Port Richmond March 1. The company will be in receipt of about 3000 cars or 10,000 tons daily, and will be able to lead from twenty to thirty vessels a day. Consequently they will be able to give better dispatch than any other shippers. Hereafter the company has provided individual shippers from Port Richmond of taking advantage of the arrival of fleets of colliers at Delaware breakers to depress the rates of freight, this dispatch of the company of vessels from coming to Port Richmond. The Philadelphia and Reading Coal and Iron Company does not wish such a policy to be continued, but that, on the contrary, it will be their interest and aim to give living rates of freight, and give prompt dispatch to all vessels. An amount of coal and facilities for their dispatch will be obtained more than a day or two.
