Chinese Laborers Attacked.
SAN FRANCISCO, August 9.—A camp of Chinese laborers on the narrow gauge railroad, near Benicia, was attacked yesterday by a crowd of drunken white men, who tore down the tent and clubbed and killed the Chinamen. The Chinese fled like sheep into the hills, and all work was suspended. Several of the assaulted laborers were subsequently found miles away from the place of work.

CUBA.
Reported Capture of Cienfuegos by Carlist Spanish forces. It is reported in Spanish circles in this city that telegrams from Havana were received here yesterday by Spanish commercial houses and by high Spanish functionaries in the country to the effect that General Portillo, at the head of 3000 men, had entered and captured Cienfuegos without a shot being fired, and that he thereupon proceeded to the city of Spain, in the presence of many of the leading Spaniards of Havana, including generals in the army, colonels and volunteer regiments.

The Jesuits and several of the leading slave traders of the island are said to be co-conspirators with General Portillo for the overthrow of the republican government of Spain.

HAVANA, August 9.—El Grito Fugado, a new republican paper, has appeared.

Abandoned Insurgent Camp Destroyed.
A Spanish telegram from Puerto Principe announces the destruction of a large abandoned insurgent camp of the enemy near Saratonia, in Holguin.

A Practical Game.
A game recently invented in the French army by Colonel Lervat, consists of a map of the terrain on which it is intended to maneuver. Small paratroops of pasted-on figures are attached to the map, and represent the troops. Some represent battalions, other platoons, batteries and squadrons. Plain pins represent sharpshooters, pines, with black heads, cavalry troops, pins, with flags, brigade or division staff. Wooden parallelpiped designate train wagons, and with a red cross the ambulances. This simple apparatus enables the general to make a plan of the combined formation, to learn the import of this or that movement, or how to value a combination of movements, and become well informed on the dangerous fire-zones and condition of the country.
