THE YELLOW FEVER OF 1873.

An Epidemic Impossible—What the Figures Say.

The report of the Board of Health for the week ending at six o'clock on Sunday night shows a total of only 138 deaths, fourteen of which were of yellow fever.

There is such a healthy exhibit for this season of the year that all existing and coming must cease. There is no opportunity to get up any further sensational reports about yellow fever becoming epidemic.

An epidemic of yellow fever at this season is shown by all facts and precedents to be an unheard of thing. The sanitary records of this city, running back to 1857, during which time there have been a great many yellow fever epidemics, show no single instance where an epidemic has occurred after the end of September; that is, if the disease had not become epidemic in the month of September, it had not become epidemic at all.

Again, the collated statistics for fifty years show that the average maximum of the disease occurred the middle of September. This has been the case this year. The following table gives the whole number of deaths of yellow fever this year, as shown by the weekly returns to the Board of Health:

YELLOW FEVER.

Deaths at Shreveport. MEMPHIS, Oct. 5.—There were forty-eight interments yesterday, including twenty-six from yellow fever.

For the week there were 240 deaths, of which 146 were from yellow fever, against fifty-eight deaths the previous week. Total number of deaths since the disease appeared, 302, all of which, save a few, occurred in the twenty-four hours ending at 6 P. M. The German Bundschuh earnestly appeals to the German societies and Germans generally for aid in nursing their sick and paying their dead. Contributions to be sent to P. Stilling, treasurer.

Aid for Shreveport. NATCHES, Oct. 6.—The collections for Shreveport here amount to over \$50. It will be forwarded to-morrow.

Knoville Furnishes Relief. KNOXVILLE, Oct. 6.—\$100 has been received for the Memphis sufferers. The city of Knoxville is progressing. The Masons and Odd Fellows hold a meeting to-night for the purpose of obtaining further relief.

Deaths at Montgomery. MONTGOMERY, Ala., Oct. 6.—No yellow fever death reported for the forty-eight hours ending at noon today. Total number of deaths since September 19, eight, according to the report of the board of health.

Louisville Raising a Noble Fund. LOUISVILLE, Oct. 6.—The Board of Trade in forty-eight hours has obtained subscriptions to the amount of \$5000 for Memphis and Shreveport. Another large meeting will be held to-day. Committees have been appointed to canvass the whole city. The churches contributed \$2000 yesterday. The Louisville Fair will raise \$15,000 for the same cause. The ladies are working energetically. The Masons raised \$1200 to-night.

Washington. WASHINGTON, Oct. 6.—The President has requested the Secretary of War to direct the French general to send 10,000 rations to Memphis, Tennessee, for the yellow fever sufferers.

Thanks from Shreveport. A telegram has been received here from the Howard Association at Shreveport expressing gratitude for the action of the government in sending rations for the sufferers there.

Paying Census Takers.
