United States Supreme Court.

The following decisions were rendered March 17, 1874: United States vs. Jones—Error to the Circuit Court for Louisiana. The government sold certain real estate in New Orleans, and Jones became the purchaser for \$30,000. Jones refused to pay the balance, and the government sold the property to another party. Jones sought to recover the property, claiming that the sale was void.

Present City Live Stock Landing and Slaughterhouse Company vs. P. C. Montgomery. sequestration of the property, which had all the time remained in the possession of Power, sends him the note and asks that he be allowed to take possession of the property. The order for sequestration issued, and the sheriff took possession of the effects. The defendant answers that the above goods were not his, and further answers he says that he admits his signature to the note and document annexed to plaintiff's petition, but avers that the note was given to him by the defendant, and that the document purporting to be a sale of the property therein mentioned was in fact never intended to be signed by him, and that he never intended as a collateral to secure its payment. He prays that plaintiff's demand be dismissed.

CITY COUNCIL—OFFICIAL

REGULAR MEETING.

The Council met this day at 12 M., in regular session.

Present—Hon. Louis A. Wiltz, Mayor, presiding, and Administrators Brewster, Calhoun, Fitzner, Lewis, Schneider, Strucken and Turnbull.

The minutes of the last meeting were approved.

Financial Business and Other Bills on Final Passage.

Mr. Calhoun called up the ordinance described as follows, which having been read twice, were now on third reading, and passed unanimously, the yeas and nays having been called on each, and all the members present at roll call voting: "Providing for the payment of the several accounts therein named," beginning A. W. Dearie.

Mr. Calhoun also called up the resolution, laid over at the meeting of the ninth instant, providing for an issue of wharf improvement bonds to William Henry, and the resolution being on its third reading, it passed unanimously, the yeas and nays having been called, and all the Administrators voting.

Mr. Turnbull called up the ordinance introduced by him, at the last meeting, "to prevent the wharves and levees of the city from being obstructed by ballast" and the ordinance passed unanimously.

Mr. Brewster reported that he had leased the city powder house property to D. Guichard, for \$100 per annum, the lease received at the pleasure of the Council. The action of the Administrator was approved.

Mr. Brewster, in relation to the communication of the president of the Board of Health, asking that provision be made for payment of the salaries of the sanitary inspectors, reported that if they be paid, according to the pay rolls presented, there must be an alteration of the budget, since it provides but \$9000 for the year for this expenditure, whereas the rolls are made out at \$12,300 per month, or \$99,900 per annum. The report was approved.

Mr. Strucken reported unfavorably on the petition of John Hession, A. Voisin, Widow H. Millaudon, Nicholas Ansemann, A. Wang and Samuel Kahn, in relation to their assessments, respectively. Received.
