It is supposed that this situation will continue another week.

The Battle Before Bilboa. MARCH 27.—The battle of Thursday before Bilboa, lasted thirteen American dispatches from Marshal Serrano are very good. Sixteen heavy guns were in good position for the attack on Pedro Abante, Friday.

Movement Among the Jesuits. VIENNA, March 28.—Several deputes have presented resolutions in the lower house of the Reichstag requiring the government to expel from the country the Jesuits and all orders affiliated therewith.

Remarkable Conduct of the King of Italy. ROME, March 28.—It is reported that King Victor Emmanuel burned the address sent to him from a number of citizens of Trieste because it contained reasonable sentiments toward Austria; and it is also said, he will send to the Austrian government a formal disavowal of sympathy with its address.

Important Treaty Consummated with Russia. ST. PETERSBURG, March 28.—United States Minister Jewell to day signed a declaration respecting trade marks. It gives American manufacturers certain rights with those of Russia, thus completely protecting the interests of Americans. This is the first Treaty signed in both the Russian and English languages.

The Fenian Convicts. LONDON, March 28.—In the House of Commons to-day, Mr. Anderson asked how many Fenian convicts were still undergoing sentence, where they were imprisoned, and whether the government was or was not of opinion that the time for their release had arrived.

Mr. Cross, Home Minister, replied that the total number of prisoners was sixteen. Two were now undergoing sentence for the Manchester murder, but none for the Clacken murder. Two were serving terms under sentence of imprisonment for fifteen years, one for seven years, and eleven, who had been soldiers, were sentenced for life, having been convicted of assisting in the murder of a woman.

They were distributed as follows: Three in England, eight in one part of Australia, two in another, and two in Ireland. Mr. Cross concluded by declaring the government had no intention of interfering with the execution of their sentences.

Strikes of Coal Miners. The coal miners of Staffordshire, to the number of 12,000, have struck work.

Coming Home. John Watson, president of the Erie Railway Company, sails to-day for New York. Oxford and Cambridge Boat Race.

The annual race between the Oxford and Cambridge boat crews came off this morning at Henley-on-Thames, on Putney to Norfolk, a distance of four miles and two furlongs, and, as has been the case in the past four years, victory went to the Cambridge boat, which came in two lengths ahead of its rival. The water was beautiful, and a more propitious day for the contest could not have been selected.

The crowd that assembled to witness the race was unprecedented. On the Surrey side of the river, from Putney to Mortlake, there was one continuous line of people 150 feet wide, and at the latter place carriages, five deep, stood in long rows.

The Princess of Wales and the Duchess of Edinburgh, were expected to be among the spectators. Upon the top for choice of positions the Cambridge row and selected Middlesex or northern side.

The Oxford crew rowed into the stream at one minute past eleven o'clock. Five minutes later the Cambridge boat appeared and was received with immense cheering by its friends.

Immediately after receiving the word to start, both boats took water together, but after a few pulls of the oars Cambridge was a quarter of a length ahead of Oxford, and at Bishop's creek three furlongs from the aqueduct bridge to the starting point, were nearly clear of their opponents. Here the steering of both boats became eccentric, and time was bad between Craven Point and Hammersmith bridge. The cockswain of the Oxford boat steered wildly.

Of Cambridge, seven furlongs from Bishop's creek, Oxford decreased the lead of Cambridge by a plucky spurt, and at Soap works, about one mile and four furlongs from Arneton bridge, Cambridge was clear behind. At Hammersmith bridge, about two furlongs and a half from Soap works, Cambridge lost half a length by bad steering, and Oxford, who had been clear, went on again ahead fast. The dock blues made another spurt, and drew up nearly level with contacts, and off Chiswick Church succeeded in getting one-quarter of a length in advance.

The excitement then became intense, and cheers upon cheers from Oxford's supporters rang out for miles. Cambridge, however, in Craven Reach, about two miles and a half from Aqueduct bridge, Cambridge took the lead again and passed Barnes' bridge, about seven furlongs beyond Craven Reach, a length and a half ahead of Oxford. Here Oxford rowed wildly, and Cambridge kept the lead to the end, reaching the stake bridge at 3.30, four minutes in advance of their opponents, and the cheering cheers of their friends on shore.

Both crews were very much exhausted when the race terminated, but Oxford appeared to be more fatigued than Cambridge. The victors and their opponents dined together at Criterion Restaurant, the members of the Oxford crew having declined an invitation from Lord May to look to both crews to dine in Egyptian Hall, of the Mansion House.

Rev. Dr. Stark Dead. PHILADELPHIA, March 28.—The Rev. Dr. T. Stark, formerly pastor of St. Marks' Lutheran Church in Baltimore, and St. Andrew's Church, Philadelphia, died here last night. He was editor of the Lutheran Home Monthly at the time of his death.

Bloody Affair at Covington. CINCINNATI, March 28.—W. L. Tyrrell, the Covington correspondent of the Cincinnati Commercial, shot and killed the Hon. Harvey Meyers at Covington, Kentucky, to-day. Both are very prominent men in Kentucky. The shooting was the result of a grudge of long standing.

Colonel Tyrrell also being shot. Hon. Harvey Meyers, of Covington, this noon did not attempt to escape. His friends thought he was on the point of insanity, and anticipated pending by his wife for divorce, and the effects of a stab, nearly killing him, which he received a few months ago. Meyers was attorney for Colonel Tyrrell's wife, and his offense seemed to have been in certain questions he asked in the examination of the divorce case. This morning Tyrrell went to Meyers' room, and the two were alone. It was at this time that Tyrrell refused to eject him, and was shot. His dying statement has been taken. Both men were prominent, and extensively known.
