Superior District Court.

Folsom & Brother vs. city of New Orleans. Verdict for plaintiff of \$15,000.

State vs. Charles Clinton et al., Semmes & Mott, W. H. Hunt, intervenors.—Appeal taken by the Attorney General to the Superior Court.

The Attorney General stated that in order to be troubled no more by rules to set the injunction aside, he would move for a default, and leaving to all parties to file an answer before confirmation, it was entered.

Mrs. W. P. Noble vs. Charles Clinton, Auditor. Verdict for plaintiff of \$15,000.

A default was entered against the defendant, and he was ordered to pay the amount of the judgment with interest.

The case was disposed of by Justice Stiles by a fine of \$250 on Thursday. After that the justice ordered the clerk to deliver the property in court. The clerk refused, and was committed to the jail for twenty-four hours or until he should obey.

The court ordered the maintenance of the writ was want of jurisdiction.

St. Charles Theatre.

Levee Topics.

There was but little talk on the subject of levee, high water and crevasses yesterday, and it seemed as if all fear had subsided on the part of city dwellers. Probably coast residents are quite different.

The news from the lower coast was unimportant, and matters down there seemed to remain as already reported.

All along the city front the water does not look as threatening as it did Wednesday, and the levee is believed to be tolerably firm.

At the Levee Company office there were a few dispatches. One stated that the water at Bayou Sara was at the levee top, but the result of 403 men constantly laboring will soon tell. Provisions for the laborers were sent, and Mr. D. F. Kenner yesterday telegraphed back authorizing one of the company's agents to procure all that was needed in any event. At Point Coupee the number of men employed is sufficient to soon place everything in proper condition.

Court Items.

In the Superior District Court Judge Cotton called the attention of the court to the promulgation of the law establishing the new Criminal Court, and suggested the order of the court should be discharged. Judge Hawkins concurred in the views of the *amateur*, and in discharging the juror remarked that he would take that opportunity to give notice to counsel that a new jury would be impaneled as soon as practicable.

In the First District Court all cases were continued, and the impaneling of the jury postponed. Monday Judge Atocha will open the Superior Criminal Court in this court room, which will be used till the new rooms are ready. It is understood that the old bank building, corner of Conti and Royal streets, now owned by the city, will be assigned for that purpose. The drawing of jurors from the names selected by the Commissioners, will commence Monday.

The appointment of Captain W. H. Green to a clerkship in Judge Long's court can not fail to be acceptable. Mr. Green possesses the qualifications which fit him in an eminent degree for the performance of the duties of his new place.
