THE WHITE LEAGUE OF ST. MARY.

Programme and Declaration of Principles.

The following is a copy of the Magna Charta of the deluded Democracy of St. Mary, by means of which they hope to recapture the office next fall...

By-laws of the Franklin White League Club No. 1, of the parish of St. Mary.

ARTICLE I.—NAME OF CLUB.—The name of the club shall be Franklin Club No. 1, of the White League of the parish of St. Mary.

ARTICLE II.—MEMBERSHIP.

All white males may become members by signing the declaration of principles and programme adopted by the White League.

ARTICLE III.—DUTIES OF MEMBERS.

All persons who are admitted as members of this club shall conform to the by-laws, abide cheerfully by all action of the club, give their active and prompt assistance in carrying out the same...

ARTICLE IV.—EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

There shall be an executive committee to be composed of the president, vice president and secretary and four other members...

ARTICLE V.—CORRESPONDING SECRETARY.

In addition to the officers provided in the signed programme of the league, there shall be a corresponding secretary...

ARTICLE VI.—MEETINGS.

The regular meetings of the club shall be on every Thursday evening at the hour of eight o'clock from the first of May to the thirty-first of September...

Your committee to whom was referred the subject of grading the schools of Carrollton, reported as follows: To the Board of School Directors of the City of New Orleans.

THE WHITE LEAGUE OF ST. MARY.

Your committee to whom was referred the subject of grading the schools of the late city of Carrollton respectfully report: That the question is not one simply of ascertaining the comparative condition of the schools of Carrollton, but involves the subject of salary.

THE WHITE LEAGUE OF ST. MARY.

It would, on first consideration, seem that teachers of like grade under the same School Board should have the same salary. But the budget and estimate for the schools of the city as formerly bounded, were made in October, 1873, and the levy of one-fourth of one per cent was accordingly made by the Council in December, 1873, expressly for the support of the public schools for 1874.

THE WHITE LEAGUE OF ST. MARY.

We must look, then, for such provision as may have been made for the schools of Carrollton this year. This includes whatever may come by quarterly appropriation of the State school tax to that district. Your committee have not the necessary data to estimate this revenue now.

THE WHITE LEAGUE OF ST. MARY.

We could, however, arrive at the city or local tax levied in addition to the State tax for public schools, had it not been in Carrollton, mixed with the ordinary city tax. The Carrollton council levied, on the 15th of December, 1873, one per cent for salary of city officers, employes, schools, gas and other incidental expenses for the year 1874.

THE WHITE LEAGUE OF ST. MARY.

This tax becomes by annexation an asset of the city of New Orleans, and the purposes of the city of New Orleans, which control the local school boards outside of New Orleans have the power to call on municipal or parish authorities for a local tax of twenty-five cents on the hundred dollars.

THE WHITE LEAGUE OF ST. MARY.
