STATE ELECTION.

APPROXIMATING THE RESULT. DUBUCLET'S MAJORITY.

TWO CONGRESSMEN BEATEN. THREE PROBABLY ELECTED.

ONE DISTRICT IN DOUBT. THE NEXT LEGISLATURE.

The majority for Dubuclet, for State Treasurer, is still in doubt, although his election is conceded by intelligent and reflecting Democrats.

Official returns from twenty-three parishes, including Orleans, foot up a majority of 5792 for Dubuclet.

First Congressional District. Although the official vote for Plaquemine parish has not been received, it can not materially affect the majority for General Gibson, whose election is conceded.

Second Congressional District. Mr. Ellis has defeated General Dibble by a handsome majority, though the votes of St. John, St. James and Jefferson make a material reduction in the figures previously given.

Third Congressional District. Although full returns are not received, majorities are given which show Congressman Darvall's reelection by a respectable majority.
