International Law.

The association for the reform and codification of the law of nations has closed its second annual conference, held at the Hotel de Ville, of this city, in the hall made historical by having witnessed the sittings of the Alabama arbitration commission. It was attended by distinguished statesmen from Italy, Spain, France, England, Germany, Switzerland, Holland, Belgium, the United States, and even Japan. A definitive commission of the law of nations was organized, the president being Dr. Dudley Field, of New York, and the general secretary, Dr. James B. Mies, of Boston. Count Solovoy, of Turin, the president of the law of nations commission, was elected honorary president. Two international secretaries were also appointed--Mr. H. C. Tucker, barrister, to reside in London, and Mr. Frederik Perry in Paris. The members were divided into English and French, though the former language predominated, the English speaking members present outnumbering the other. The president, Mr. Field, took the place that which was frequently necessary--namely, to translate summarily from the one to the other for the most important questions. The determination of the time and place of meeting for the conference of 1875 was left to the council, it being generally understood that the next meeting would be held in London.
