For coffee and chocolate stands, three by eight feet, fifty cents per day, and two cents per day for every additional superficial foot, and for each corner table an additional five cents, and it shall be the duty of the City Surveyor to designate which are corner tables.

All occupants of stalls and stands are required to keep the same in good condition as when received, and the lessees of markets are required to return the stalls, stands and fixtures of the markets to the city in as good condition as when received from the city.
