On motion of Mr. Greene, the bill was fixed for to-morrow at one o'clock.

Mr. Wharton called up the following report from the Committee on Judiciary, on Senate bill No. 112, a joint resolution to create a committee of three members of the Senate and four members of the House of Representatives, to be appointed respectively by the President of the Senate and Speaker of the House, to inquire into the pay, emoluments, fees, etc., of the various public offices of the State, with power to send for persons, books and papers; to administer oaths; making appropriations to pay the expenses of said committee; said committee to report the result of their labor at the meeting of the next session of the General Assembly, and such recommendations for the necessary legislation to equalize and reduce the pay, emoluments, fees, etc., of the various public offices of the State, with the view of saving the State and its citizens from the payment of exorbitant and expensive charges and expense. Favorably, with the following amendments in the title: In line twelve and thirteen strike out the words "making appropriation to pay the expenses of said committee." In section two, strike out all of the section after the word "form."

The report was adopted.

Bill adopted as amended.

The constitutional rule was suspended by a four-fifths vote, the bill was read the third time, and finally passed, its title adopted, and it stood enacted.

Mr. Twitchell, by unanimous consent, called up the following:

House bill No. 21, to be entitled an act transferring the parishes of Red River and Natchitoches from the Seventh Judicial District of the State of Louisiana.

The bill was adopted on its second reading.

Mr. Sypher called up House bill No. 100, to be entitled an act to repeal and re-enact sections 2180, 2186, 2192, 2188, 2191 and 2192 of the Revised Statutes of the State of Louisiana, and of said sections 2180, 2187 and 2188, as repealed and re-enacted by act No. 51, approved March 18, 1873. Reported upon unfavorably by Judiciary Committee.

The bill was taken up, and on motion of Mr. Sypher was recommitted to the Committee on Judiciary.

Mr. Wharton called up House bill No. 37, substitute for House bill No. 8, to be entitled an act to amend and re-enact sections 925, 926 and 927 of the Revised Statutes of the State of Louisiana.

On motion of Mr. Burch the following words were added as an amendment to each section:

After the words "hard labor" insert "in the State Penitentiary."

On motion of Mr. Wharton the bill was ordered to be engrossed.

The constitutional rule was suspended by a four-fifths vote, the bill was read the third time and passed, and the title adopted.

SPECIAL ORDER OF THE DAY.

Senate bill No. 86, entitled an act to create a board of inspectors and measurers of lumber, timber and staves for the city and port of New Orleans and Carrollton, State of Louisiana, and defining the duties of said board.

The bill was ordered to be engrossed.

The constitutional rule was suspended by a four-fifths vote and the bill read the third time.

Mr. Burch moved to reconsider the vote by which the constitutional rule was suspended.

Mr. Whitney moved to table the motion to reconsider.

On call of two Senators the yeas and nays were ordered.

The vote was then reconsidered.

On motion of Mr. Burch the vote was reconsidered by which the bill was ordered engrossed.

Mr. Anderson in the chair, declared the bill on the second reading.

Mr. Stamps moved to take the bill out of section by section.

So ordered.

[The President in the chair.] Section first was read.

Mr. Stamps moved to strike out the first section.

During the debate it was suggested that Mr. Anderson had the closing argument, as he was the introducer of the bill.

Mr. Burch made the point of order that Mr. Anderson has only a right to close the debate on the final adoption of the bill, not on the motion to strike out.

The President sustained the point of order, and stated as the bill was ordered to be read by the Senate it would be necessary to vote to discontinue the reading.

On motion of Mr. Burch the further reading was dispensed with, and on motion of Mr. Weber the Senate voted to adjourn until to-morrow at 11 A. M.

The President, in the chair, then declared that the Senate stood adjourned until Friday, February 26, at 11 A. M.
