The report was received and adopted, and the bill referred to the Committee on Claims.
Mr. Pines, chairman of the Committee on Education, reported favorably on House bill No. 21, entitled an act relative to the collection and distribution of the school tax, providing for the expenses of the boards of education, limiting the special school tax for the city of New Orleans, and repealing all laws in conflict with the provisions hereof, which underwent its first and second readings by its title and was referred to the Committee on Education, and ordered to be printed, and made the special order of the day for half past three o'clock to-morrow.

Mr. Stafford, chairman of the Committee on Printing, made a favorable report on House bill No. 79, entitled an act relative to public printing, and the publication of ordinances, advertisements, proceedings, etc., of the corporation of the city of New Orleans.
The report was received and the bill placed on the calendar.

Also on House bill No. 71, entitled an act to repeal an act entitled "an act relative to public printing," approved the twenty-fourth of July, 1868, and to repeal an act entitled "an act relative to judicial and legal advertisements," No. 94 of the acts of 1870, and to repeal sections 2986, 2987, 2988, 2990, 2991, 2992, and 2993 of the Revised Statutes of the State of Louisiana; and to regulate and define the rates and prices of the public printing, and to prescribe the manner in which the same shall be done.
Mr. Demas moved that the bill be printed and made the special order of the day for two o'clock to-morrow.

Mr. McCullum, chairman of the Committee on Lands and Leases, reported favorably on House bill No. 19, entitled an act for the relief of planters and other landholders whose crops, live stock and other property were destroyed and lands overflowed by the crevasse of the year 1874, and to provide for obtaining exemption from taxation of the same.

An act: to limit the amount to be paid by the city of New Orleans for the support of the public schools; to reduce the expenses thereof; and to authorize the reduction of taxation in conformity therewith. Sec. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Louisiana in General Assembly convened, That from and after the first day of June, 1875, the amount required from the city of New Orleans for the support of the public schools of said city shall not exceed the sum of \$200,000 per year; and the board of directors of the public schools for the city of New Orleans shall immediately reduce the expenses for all purposes of the public schools to conform thereto.

Sec. 2. Be it further enacted, etc., That the board of directors of the city of New Orleans be and are hereby authorized to reduce the rate of taxation to conform to the reduction authorized by the provisions of this act.
Sec. 3. Be it further enacted, etc., That all laws or parts of laws contrary to the provisions of this act, and bearing upon the same subject matter, be and the same are hereby repealed.
Sec. 4. Be it further enacted, etc., That this act shall take effect from and after its passage.

Mr. Wiltz also reported favorably on House bill No. 74, entitled an act for the appropriation of the revenues derived by the city of New Orleans from the wharves and levees, and for the reduction of the charges for the use of the wharves and levees.
The report was received, bill considered engrossed, and under suspension of the rules passed its third reading, was adopted by its title, was finally passed and ordered sent to the Senate for concurrence.

Mr. Wiltz also reported favorably on House bill No. 49, entitled an act providing for the salaries of the justices of the peace and constables of the parish of Jefferson, right bank, in criminal cases, substitute for House bill No. 6.
The report was received, the bill considered engrossed, and under suspension of the rules passed its third reading, was adopted by its title, was finally passed and ordered sent to the Senate for concurrence.

The rules were suspended, the bill passed its second reading, and referred to the Committee on City Affairs.
