

CITY COUNCIL—OFFICIAL

REGULAR MEETING.

The Council met this day at twelve o'clock M. in regular session.

Present—Hon. Charles J. Leods, Mayor, presiding, and Administrators Bertoli, Brown, Burke, Landry, McCarthy and Pilibury.

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved and their reading dispensed with.

Communications from the Mayor and Administrators.

The following communication from the Mayor was received and read:

MAJORITY OF NEW ORLEANS, City Hall, February 1, 1876.

To the City Council of New Orleans.

I return, at the request of the honorable Administrator of Public Accounts, an ordinance providing for the payment of the several accounts therein named, passed by the Council January 11, 1876, for reconsideration.
