MESSAGE FROM THE SENATE. The following message was received from the Senate: SENATE CHAMBER, New Orleans, February 15, 1876. To the Honorable Speaker and Members of the House of Representatives: I am directed to inform your honorable body that the Senate concurs in the passage of the following bill: House bill No. 151, entitled an act to amend and re-enact section thirteen of act No. 9, approved February 27, 1871, styled "An act to provide for the supplying the land public records and other papers contained by the burning of the court records of the parish of Morehouse on the sixteenth of March, 1870."

BILLS INTRODUCED AND REFERRED. The hereinafter named members, in accordance with previous notice given, respectively asked and obtained leave to introduce the hereinafter entitled bills, which were their first and second readings and their titles, and they were disposed of as indicated below, to wit: Mr. Byrnes: An act to amend and re-enact article 259 of the Code of Practice.

Mr. Baker: An act to extend the criminal jurisdiction of the justice of the peace of the eighth ward of the parish of Bossier.

Mr. Grant: An act granting a privilege to physicians in the crops of laborers.

Mr. Koonz: An act to encourage manufacturing industries in the State of Louisiana, and to grant licenses for manufacturers in certain cases.

Mr. Sutton: An act to amend and re-enact section 3717 of the Revised Statutes of the State of Louisiana.

Mr. Hammond: All of which bills were ordered to be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Mr. Hammond: An act to increase the revenues of the State of Louisiana and of the new State of Louisiana.

Which bill was ordered to be referred to the Committee on Corporations.

Mr. Jones, of Point Coupee: Joint resolution ordering the repair of the State roads in the parish of Pointe Coupee, and the manner of repairing the same.

Mr. Keating: An act granting to A. J. Jones, of the parish of Caddo and State of Louisiana, his heirs or assigns, the right of establishing a ferry or toll bridge across Tones bayou, on the road known as the Red river road in the parish of Caddo and State of Louisiana, and to raise a revenue for the school fund for the parish of Caddo, State of Louisiana.

Both of which bills were ordered to be referred to the Committee on Parochial Affairs.

Mr. Walters: An act for the relief of John C. Howard.

Which bill was ordered to be referred to the Committee on Claims.

Mr. Booth: Joint resolution for joint committee to report the votes of 1872, and report to the next General Assembly.

Mr. Kidd: An act to fix the terms of the district courts in the parish of Lincoln.

Both of which bills underwent their first reading, and were ordered to a second reading.

Mr. Edwards, of Tangipahoa: An act to fix and establish a return day for appeals to the Supreme Court of the State from the courts of the parish of Tangipahoa.

Which bill underwent its several readings, and passed.

Mr. Keyes: Joint resolution memorializing the national Congress to grant the aid of the national government in rebuilding the jail and the other parish buildings in the parish of Terrebonne that were destroyed by troops of the United States.

Which underwent its several readings and it was adopted.

Mr. Bayley: An act to confirm the notarial charter of the New Orleans Pacific Railway Company, with amendments thereto, and to extend the term of existence of said company, and to confer thereon certain powers and franchises.

Which underwent its several readings, and it passed.

On motion of the same member the amendment of the Judiciary Committee was adopted, to wit:

To strike out the seventh section of the bill, and to insert in lieu thereof the following, to be the seventh section:

Be it further enacted, That the Governor shall appoint, by and with the advice and counsel of the Senate, a sufficient number of justices of the peace and constables to fill the requirements of the law, who shall hold their office until their successors are elected and qualified, as provided for in this act.

On motion of the same member the rules were suspended, the bill underwent its second and third readings, and it passed.

On motion of Mr. Wiltz the House adjourned until to-morrow at twelve o'clock.
