COURT RECORD.

United States Circuit Court. Present—Hon. W. B. Woods, circuit judge. L. M. Fournay, president of Commercial Bank of Kentucky, vs. Alf. Lustrupes, in accordance with the verdict of defendant deeded to be the owner of 291 arpents of land in St. Mary parish.

Superior District Court. City of New Orleans vs. New Orleans, Mobile and Texas Railroad Company, and E. D. Morgan and James A. Layton et al. The petition alleges that defendants are laying and about to lay a railroad track on the levee, between Bienville and Elysian Fields streets; that this impairs the use of the streets by the public, obstructs commerce and interferes with public convenience; and that they are altering the grades, and pray that they be restrained. Injunction issued without bond.
