LAWS OF THE STATE OF LOUISIANA.

REGULAR SESSION OF 1876.

AN ACT No. 18.

To incorporate the St. Patrick's Savings Bank, and prescribing its powers and privileges.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Louisiana in General Assembly convened, that the following named persons, their associates and successors, to wit: John Henderson, William B. Brown, and Patrick Irwin, of the city of New Orleans, are hereby created and constituted a body corporate...

SECTION 2. Be it further enacted, etc., that the corporation shall have the power to contract, buy and sell, and to use and intervene in any suit, and to do and perform any and all other acts allowed by law to corporations of this State...

SECTION 3. Be it further enacted, etc., that the capital stock of this corporation is hereby divided into one hundred shares, each of the value of one hundred dollars...

SECTION 4. Be it further enacted, etc., that the board of directors of this corporation shall consist of five persons named in the beginning of this act...

SECTION 5. Be it further enacted, etc., that the board of directors of this corporation shall have full authority to fill all vacancies in their number from among the stockholders of this corporation...

SECTION 6. Be it further enacted, etc., that the board of directors of this corporation shall have full authority to borrow money, and to do all and singular such acts as may be necessary to carry on the business...

SECTION 7. Be it further enacted, etc., that in all elections the vote shall be by ballot, and each and every stockholder shall be entitled to vote, either in person or by proxy...

SECTION 8. Be it further enacted, etc., that the corporation may be dissolved before the expiration of this charter at a general meeting to be convened for the purpose after thirty days' notice...
