AN ACT No. 19.

Making an appropriation of one hundred and seventy-five thousand three hundred and two dollars and sixty cents out of the general funds in the State Treasury, for the year 1876, and the sum of six thousand three hundred and sixty-two dollars and eighty-five cents to pay deficiencies of the regular session of 1875, of the General Assembly, out of the revenues of said year...

WHEREAS, The New Orleans Pacific Railway Company has been duly organized by an act passed before J. G. Eastis, notary, on the 25th day of June, 1875, and it is a matter of public importance that the completion of said railway should be expedited in every lawful manner. SECTION 1.
