REGULAR MEETING. CITY COUNCIL, Monday, March 7, 1876.

The Council met this day of twelve o'clock M. in regular session. Present—Hon. Charles J. Leods, Mayor, presiding, and Administrators Bertoli, Brown, Bony, Burke, Landry, McCarthy and Fishery.

Mr. Brown called up the ordinance described as follows, which, having been read twice, were on third reading, and they passed unanimously, the yeas and nays having been called on each, and all the members present at roll call voting:

An ordinance making appropriations for the charitable institutions for the month of February, 1876. An ordinance providing for the payment of the several accounts therein named, beginning, "Firemen's Charitable Association of New Orleans."

To the City Council of New Orleans: I have the honor to inclose copy of instructions to City Surveyors, relating to 1876, and to report that the City Surveyor, in accordance therewith, has given proper grade lines, and the New Orleans and Mobile railroad assume him of their willingness to conform to the same.
