Daniel Drew's Bankruptcy.
New York, June 2.—The examination of Daniel Drew, in bankruptcy, began yesterday. He stated that he had not transacted any business for a year prior to filing his petition. He did business previously in the offices of Boyd Vincent, Johnson, Chase & Co., Dickerson & Co. and Whitney & Nelson; always did his own business; had no one in his employ; had statements of accounts from those brokers, but never looked them over; trusted to their honesty; had collaterals with those brokers, but they did not surrender them; they used them to a mere nothing; was well enough of a year ago; never kept any check book; had small accounts with the Manhattan Bank, but it was run up long ago; never had much of a bank account.

In reply to the question as to how he made payments Mr. Drew said: These were made by the bank yesterday. It would charge me on these transactions; and I always trusted to their honesty; was not in the habit of giving notes; gave some; might have paid them by giving checks; on some of the brokers, but not on except in New York; did not keep any record of notes. And when asked how he knew when he was due, he replied that he generally carried those things in his head. He once had a great deal of property, and could tell when he lost it; had several millions at one time, and could tell of what consisted by making out a statement; would not be assisted by papers or memoranda; carried those things in his head.
