LONDON, July 18.—Walker & Co., of Bradford, worsted spinners, have failed. Liabilities \$265,000.

The Free Ports Bill. The House says: The "free ports" bill now before the Italian Parliament provides that within the precincts of Ancona, Genoa, Leghorn and other large coast towns, goods may be delivered or consumed without payment of duty.

Getting Ready for War. The Financier says there has been reason to believe that in consequence of the very unsatisfactory tenor of accounts just received in London, and the prospect of some important failures, a large amount of money has been transmitted by some of the banks to coin districts.

The Public Debt of Spain. MADRID, July 18.—The Senate has passed the bill for the settlement of the public debt, and commenced the debate.

VERSAILLES, July 18.—The Senate has commenced the discussion of the university bill. M. Walton proposed that the debate be adjourned until next session. The discussion will be resumed to-morrow.

WAR. Campaign of the Disturbed Region.—Condition of the Sultan-Turkish Atrocities.

LONDON, July 18.—The Standard's Vienna telegram says: The Montenegro official paper states openly that the Prince of Montenegro means to conduct the war on his own account. He will have no alliance with Servia, though the Servians are in operations useful as engaging the attention of a large Turkish force.

The slowness of the Montenegrin government will probably prevent the completion of the defense.

The powers consider Roumania's demands improper. Greece has bought 14,000 rifles from Germany.

General Tchernoyoff has sent a colonel to urge the Bussian societies to give their promised aid in men and money, otherwise it will be too late.

The Standard's Constantinople correspondent telegraphs that the health of the Sultan causes great anxiety. He has never recovered from the shock caused by the murder of Hussein Avin Pacha, the Minister of War. He is a mere wreck, and utterly unfit for business.

Some have positively declared that, according to the latest news from the brain have appeared. He is in imminent danger. Personally, I believe his abdication is very near at hand, and unavoidable.

You may expect to have, at any moment, the Sultan Abd-ul-Hamid, in Constantinople.

Trustworthy intelligence from Constantinople says the Sultan is greatly depressed mentally, and concludes himself from his misdeeds. The manner in which he has behaved is a manner so strange. He displayed alternately deep depression and violent fits of laughter. The investiture ceremony was delayed on account of the Sultan's condition.

The Standard's Vienna special says that General Ignatieff has received a six months furlough.

Turkish newspapers announce that the Servian General Tchernoyoff has been dislodged from Babinoglav, and is retreating. The Turks are advancing into Servia.

The Morning Post's Berlin special says Roumania has notified the powers that her mobilization is merely for the defense of her frontiers.

The report of General Olympia, concerning Turkish cruelties, says: "The Turks have killed several hundred women and children. In Bosnia they are cutting women and children to pieces, throwing them in their arms and cutting their throats with bayonets. They cut off the heads and noses of the dead and wounded, whereas the wounded Turkish prisoners are treated like the British."

Selim Pasha, who was reported blockaded at Salem, has escaped to Mostar, leaving his guns, baggage and ammunition. Mukhtar Pasha is fortifying the hills south of Mostar, and is concentrating troops from the Bosnian and German frontiers.

The Foreign Office has received a telegram from the British ambassador at Constantinople, stating that the Sultan has been called to reinforce the corps of observation, which is intended to defend the neutrality of the territory.

The report received here from an authentic source confirms the report that Prince Milan's immediate followers are greatly discouraged, and that but little hope of success is entertained. The Servian army lacks ammunition and provisions.

Austrian Rights Violated. VIENNA, July 18.—The Presse says that during the engagements with the insurgent General Paulovic, on the thirteenth instant, near Kieck, a Turkish man-of-war fired a shot which killed a young girl, the daughter of a high official. The Austrian man-of-war stationed there. The Presse says this is a flagrant violation of the rights of neutrals.

Expected Repulse of the Turks. BELGRADE, July 18.—It is officially announced that the Turks attempted on Monday to enter Servia by way of Ljubowatz, but were repulsed.

The Turks Having to Effect a Junction.—Subjecting the Troops to Discipline. CONSTANTINOPLE, July 18.—The Turkish armies from London by the steamship Erin, are marching to effect a junction at Alexantia. The Grand Vizier has issued a proclamation in effect that the irregular troops committing outrages and other offenses upon peaceable people, will be arrested and summarily executed. Officers will be held responsible for the conduct of their men.

English Cattle for the Centennial. PHILADELPHIA, July 18.—On the tenth of August next a shipment of cattle will be sent from London by the steamship Erin, for the exhibition. These specimens will be from the flocks and herds of Lords Chesam and Walsingham, and those of the respective agricultural associations. The specimens are said to be very fine, and will number about 100 head.
