Local Intelligence.

FIRE FROM THE CLOUDS.—Yesterday morning, during the heavy rain storm, lightning struck the two-story frame edifice in the rear of the buildings Nos. 51 and 53 Pryor, between Erato and Julia streets, owned by J. H. Harvey and Mrs. Dowell, respectively, by Mrs. Leveque, Mr. M. Dowell and Mrs. Jackson, setting fire to the buildings and damaging them to the amount of \$500. The alarm was sounded from box No. 28, at the corner of Dumaine and Melpoune streets, which was responded by the fire department in time to prevent a large conflagration.

A SCHOOL TEACHER ASSAULTED AND KILLED.—Monday morning Mrs. Clarke, principal of the Lincoln School, accompanied by two of her scholars, was passing along the corner of Barron and Sobat roads at the corner of Barron and Sobat roads, when she was followed unexpectedly assaulted her. She held a small pocketbook in her left hand, which the thief grabbed, and then attempted to steal her watch and chain, but failed in the latter. The thief contained only \$1.50. Mrs. Clarke made a lively call for assistance, but no gentlemen were in that neighborhood at the time, so the sounder escaped.

NOT TRUE TO HIS TRUST.—John S. Nichols, a clerk in the tax office of A. J. Rodmond, Fifth District, and the complete confidence man placed in his honor, as he has been attended closely by his duties. About two weeks ago this young man took a sudden departure, and it was supposed that he had been given receipts therefor, but a little investigation disclosed why he had been so attentive to his work—he did not wish other clerks to learn that he had received the blank receipts from the book portion of his book. A few days ago notices were sent to delinquents to step up, and Mr. Nichols, who had been called on by Mr. Rodmond, displaying receipts signed by Nichols. Thus it became known that the unfaithful clerk in the time of at least \$1200. He fled to Texas, and was arrested in Richmond, where he will be held until another of this city reaches there to take charge of him.

TWO ON ONE.—Late Monday night Mr. Camp was waiting for a friend in front of a restaurant on Damphine, near Orleans street, when two men, L. Rance and Henry Brienne, suddenly assaulted him by pushing him off the banquette. As Mr. Camp did not understand the conduct he was asked, he was seized by the neck of his coat and sent from a revolver. One of the bullets wounded his left leg, but the wound is not serious. The assailants were arrested, and their motives are being explained. Perhaps they will ultimately say that they mistook their man, as they fail to prove an alibi.

SNEAK THIEVES.—The Friendship baron at the corner of Baronne and Lafayette streets was entered at nine o'clock Sunday night while the proprietress, Eugenee Pologne, was sitting in the parlor. A thief, dressed as a baron, and the money drawer of \$50, after which the thief made his escape. Some time afterward the bed-room of Mr. Gabriel Crotin, next to the corner of Baronne, was entered and everything ransacked for money, which he managed to find. They took a note and memorandum book, but on finding no more of value to any person but the owner, left it on the gallery, after which they made their escape.
