Still Harrowed Florida. Tallahassee, November 18.—The situation remains to be just the same. Each party claim the State on the Presidential ticket. It is pretty well conceded that the Democrats carry their State on the ticket of the electoral ticket on the official returns received here. It is believed that the votes and the canvass of the same committee have been arranged to have sworn duplicates made of the official returns made in each county and forwarded. They have received these from all save five counties, all Democratic. Their estimates, based on these unofficial copies of official returns, give Drew and Tilden both a clear majority.

On yesterday the Democratic State Committee addressed a note to the Board of State Canvassers, requesting them to proceed at once to canvass such county returns as are already in. They based this request upon the fact that a great mass of certified copies of returns had been received from both sides, and that its proper presentation and argument would take a long time, and that as the United States law requires the canvass to be completed on the sixth of December, it is necessary to begin work at once in order that a fair hearing may be had.

The board this morning declined to receive the canvass, Cooke, Democrat, voting yes, and McLean and Cozzig, Republicans, voting no. The Republican position on the canvass is to receive the certified copies of the returns, and to have the canvass completed on the sixth of December, or sooner if the vote shall be begun, and that as the time has not yet expired and the canvass is not yet begun, they can not legally begin work. The Democrats claim that there is a clause allowing the canvass to begin at any time and canvass the returns as they may see fit, and that the canvass of the returns for non-arrival until the thirty-fifth day has come. Steps will probably be taken to see if there is not in the Supreme Court a decision in favor of the Democrats.

Amos Aldrich's Desperate Hope. WASHINGTON, November 18.—The situation in Vermont regarding the electoral college, is that the Democrats will contend for everything that the law allows in the case of Postmaster Sillars. It appears that Amos Aldrich, on the 18th of November, 1876, has four more votes than his colleague, Aldrich believes, after consultation with eminent counsel, that he is entitled to a seat in the Electoral College, and will defend his right to the last.

Judge Humphreys, in the district court, made a decree in the case of Admiral Porter and others, of the North Atlantic Squadron, against Commodore Rodgers, destroyed, in value \$150,000. The decree is for the return of the property, and the officers are entitled to only one half of the value, valued at \$55,500, and the balance of \$94,500, to be paid by the Government.

NEW YORK.

A Defaulting Bank Teller Arrested. New York, November 18.—Thomas Ellis, the defaulting teller of the National Park Bank, has been arrested in Montreal.

A Mysterious Package. A flour barrel, containing the dead body of a young woman, was brought from Sorel by the steamer Montreal this morning. The man in whose possession it was found has been arrested. An investigation will be had.

FOREIGN.

The Line of Demarcation. LONDON, November 18.—Correspondents say Russia is raising fresh troubles about the line of demarcation.

Owing to the Depression of the steamer coal trade more than 1000 miners are thrown out of employment in the Northumberland collieries.

Business on the Stock Exchange was flat throughout the week, in consequence of the warlike Russian dispatches and adverse news about the situation in the East. The aggregate vote of the other candidates was 2,315,798, a total of 37,620 in excess of Mr. Buchanan, who, nevertheless, became President.

The last election was that of Mr. Lincoln's first election, in 1860. He had 180 electoral votes—twenty-nine more than a majority. His popular vote was 1,866,352. The aggregate of the other candidates was 2,811,011.

We are now, apparently, to have another instance of a minority candidate in the election of Governor Hayes, though in this case there is an important distinction from the others. Governor Hayes would have had a large majority of the popular vote, as well as of the electoral vote, for the whole of the State in the South. The only way the Democrats figure out their popular majority is by claiming majorities of 70,000 in Georgia, 75,000 in Texas, 50,000 in Michigan, and so on.

The Terrible Cyclone in India. A letter from Calcutta states that later accounts say that 120,000 persons perished during the cyclone which passed through Bengal on the thirty-first of October. The government is taking active steps for the relief of the distressed population.

A Market House Burned. HAVANA, November 18.—The market Mercado de Colon, constructed of iron, was totally destroyed by fire this morning. Loss unknown.

Prohibition. (San Francisco.) Washington, November 18, (S. F. M.) For the South Atlantic states, falling barometer, with light variable winds, and possibly rainy weather will prevail, followed by cooler, westerly winds and rising barometer.
