NEW PROPOSITION TO CAPTURE GOVERNOR PACKARD.—A friend of Governor Packard yesterday sent him the following letter...

THE SENATE. Fifty-first Day's Proceedings. New Orleans, March 1, 1877. The Senate met pursuant to adjournment at twelve o'clock M. Hon. C. C. Antoine, Lieutenant Governor and President of the Senate in the chair.

STATE OF LOUISIANA, Executive Department, New Orleans, March 1, 1877. WHEREAS, By reason of extraordinary complications in State and national politics, the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana, during its regular session, which expired to-day, has been impeded and prevented from adopting the legislation necessary for the maintenance of the government and the proper enforcement of the laws...

Now, therefore, I, Stephen B. Packard, Governor of the State of Louisiana, in conformity with article sixty-four of the constitution of the State, and act No. 19 of the session of 1870, approved February 16, 1870, do issue this my proclamation, convening the General Assembly in extra session for a period of twenty days, commencing immediately after the expiration of the regular session, and ending on Wednesday, the twenty-first day of March, at the hour of twelve o'clock meridian.

And I further specify as the particular objects for which the General Assembly is convened, which shall take precedence over all other business, the passage of an act making appropriation for the general expenses of the State for the year ending the thirty-first day of December, A. D. 1877, and the election of a United States Senator for the term...
